Crimes of note:

- 01.12.2020 A male was threatened with a screwdriver, the victim said he was threatened by an unknown male. This happened between the market square and the railway station.
- 03.12.2020 A resident of Milner Crescent in Aylesham had her parcel delivered by a local courier. Another male came and took the parcel off her. The male was aggressive when he spoke. Description of the male is a black male wearing a high vis vest, he got into a flash white vehicle no VRN. There has been a lot of theft from delivery vehicles and scams due to the season and the increased shopping online. Please be aware not all delivery vans are marked.
- 04.12.2020 Theft of Motor Vehicle. A white Transit was located in a field at the junction of Chapmans Hill and Ackholt Road, Aylesham. Checks carried out on the vehicle confirmed it was stolen. The vehicle was recovered by the Rural Task Force for CSI, the vehicle had damage to one side and the keys in the ignition. A male wearing a male wearing a dark blue bomber jacket was seen near the vehicle. - 04.12.2020 Fraud, a resident from Elvington was targeted by text message. She received a text message informing her, her National Insurance Number had been cancelled and there was a warrant out for her arrest. The text gave a code and asked her to press 1 to talk to someone, she did speak to someone who gave a name and force number, they started to talk about bank accounts etc, No money or bank details were handed over. Please remember, don't give bank details over the phone. Police will not contact threatening arrest over the phone.
- 05.12.2020 Attempt Burglary Sandwich Rd, Eythorne. Plywood was removed from the conservatory at the rear of the property. No Access was gained.

- 05.12.20 Poaching in the area of Holt Street, Nonnington. 2x people with a lurcher. Headed off in the direction of Nightingale Road towards Frogham.
- 09.12.2020 6 Nuisance motor bikes on Terrace Road Elvington, road into the field in the direction of the Tilminstone Colliery.
- 22.12.2020 Nuisance youths in Elvington, a group of 15+ were seen breaching covid in the area. Persistant Covid breaches committed by under 18's can result in a fine for the parent or care giver.
